UPPER FALL OF THE YELLOWSTONE RIVER

Yellowstone National Park

YELLOWSTONE is the oldest, largest and probably the most famous of our national playgrounds. There is no other region like it. In the diversity of its wonders, it has no rival. It is situated in northwestern Wyoming and extends slightly into Idaho and Montana; its area is 3,438 square miles. It is a broad volcanic plateau with an average elevation of 8,000 feet, and surrounded by mountain ranges rising from 2,000 to 4,000 feet higher.

In Yellowstone Park there are approximately 100 geysers, more than in all the rest of the world. The very earth puffs, steams and hisses. There are some 4,000 hot and boiling springs, and many cold springs. There are prismatic pools of exquisite beauty. Multi-colored "paint-pots" of plastic clay bubble and seethe. Mud volcanoes roar harmlessly. There are tinted, fretted terraces resembling the fancied architecture of fairyland.

The Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone is painted in gorgeous colors and is a sublime spectacle. The superbly sculptured walls present all the tones of yellow, orange, red and white. At the head of the Canyon a waterfall of great height and wonderful symmetry leaps from the evergreen hills and is lost in its own cloud of swirling spray.

Of the many wild animals, bears are perhaps first in interest in Yellowstone. However, one may see elk, deer and antelope; and, by going to their known retreats, he may see moose, mountain sheep, buffalo, beaver and many varieties of smaller animals. Two hundred species of birds are found in the Park.

The season is approximately June 20 to September 15. Through Pullmans to and from West Yellowstone, Montana, directly on the Park boundary, are operated by the Union Pacific daily during the Park travel season.
