

SUN VALLEY, IDAHO

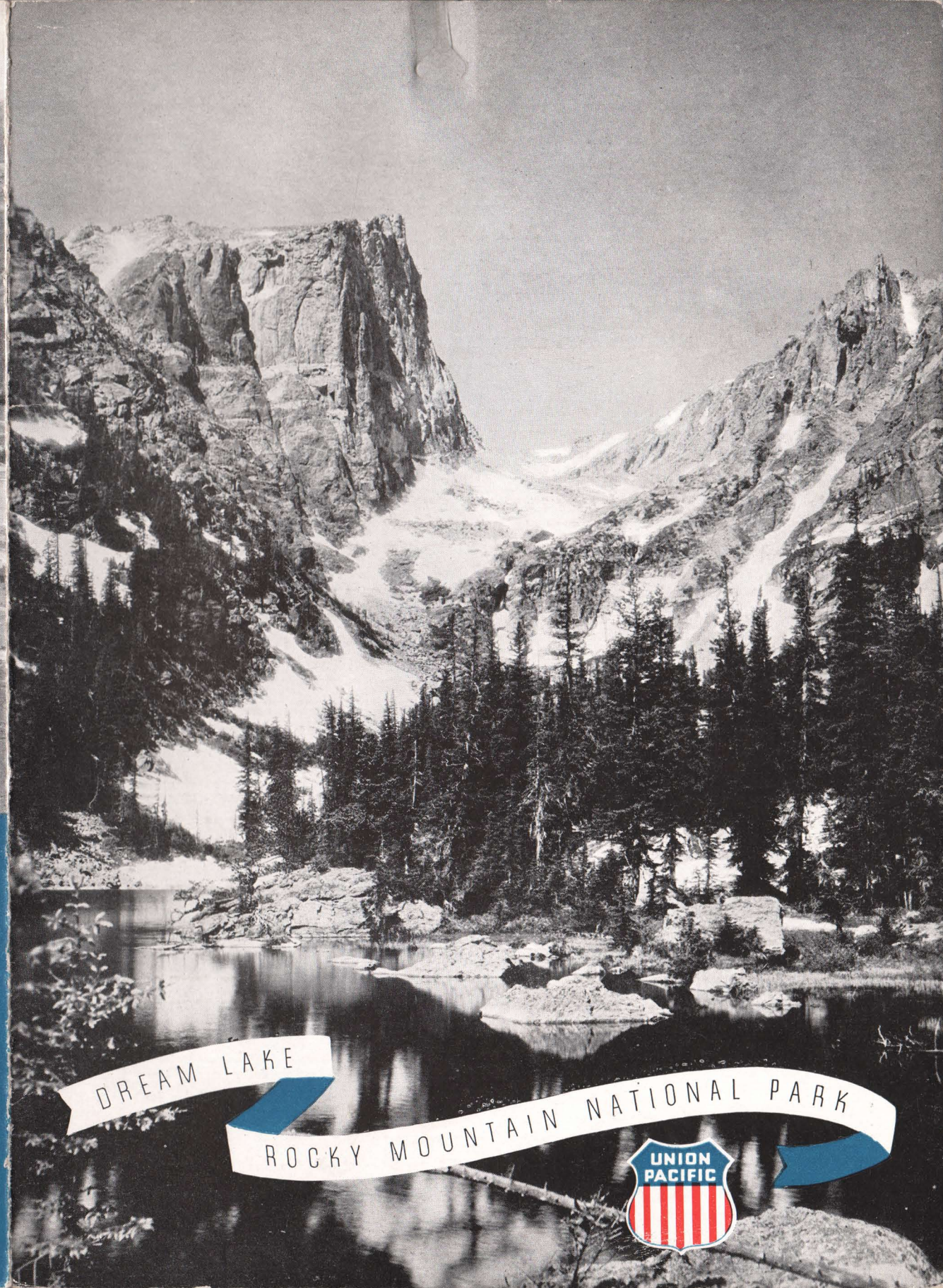
