



The College of Idaho, a coeducational institution, is located at Caldwell in the heart of the lower Snake River Valley country in southwestern Idaho. Founded in the midst of pioneer, sagebrush land in 1891 by the late Dr. William Judson Boone, the College of Idaho today reflects the courage, energy and enthusiasm of its founder.

The college campus consists of seventy-eight acres and nine buildings, the latest addition to the campus being Simplot Hall, a new dormitory for women, completed in the fall of 1948. Further expansion is planned in the near future. Its student body, numbering 522, comes mainly from the small towns and rural districts within a radius of two hundred miles, although other states, the Territory of Hawaii, and two foreign countries are represented.

The College of Idaho offers majors in the following fields: biology, chemistry, economics, education, English, French, history, Latin, mathematics, music, philosophy, physical education, physics, political science, psychology, religion and sociology. The faculty is composed of forty full-time men and women.

The college football team, known as "The Coyotes", is a strong contender each fall for honors in the Northwest conference.

The College of Idaho holds a high place among the small liberal arts colleges of the United States and many of its graduates have made notable achievements, especially in scientific fields.
