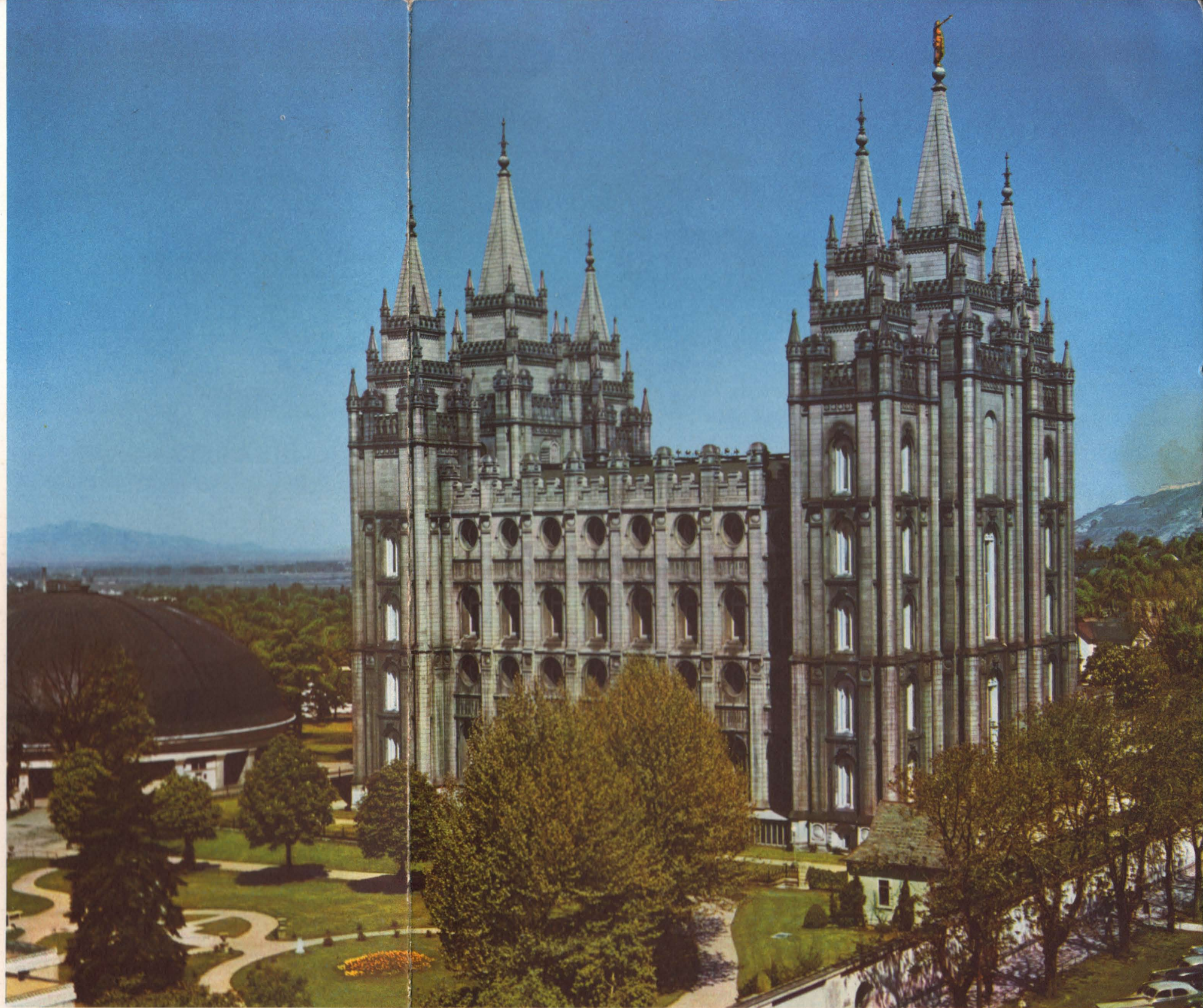




The Mormon Temple and Tabernacle, and other religious edifices in "Temple Square," are usually of chief interest to the visitor in Salt Lake City, Utah. The Mormons (Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints) have built temples from the beginning of their history. There are a number of them, beautiful and interesting structures, in western states, particularly Utah and Idaho. The one in Salt Lake City is a realization of the dreams and religious aspirations of Brigham Young who led the Mormon pioneers to Salt Lake Valley in 1847. It is built of native gray granite, and in classical design, of Romanesque and Gothic architecture. Interior decorations and furnishings are said to have an exalting beauty that is entirely in harmony with the design and purpose of the Temple. The maximum length of the building is $186\frac{1}{2}$ feet, its width $118\frac{1}{2}$ feet. The east center tower rises 210 feet. The statue of the Angel Moroni atop it is 12 feet $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches in height.
