



An act of the Provisional Government of the State of Deseret, February 28, 1850, incorporating the "University of Deseret", was ratified October 4, 1851, by the Legislature of the Territory of Utah. In November, 1850, the University was opened, but in 1852 instruction was discontinued, and was not resumed until 1867. In 1869, under Dr. John R. Park, the institution was reorganized. In 1892, under a new charter, the name was changed from the "University of Deseret" to "The University of Utah".

Today one of the outstanding state universities of the country, the University of Utah offers courses and confers degrees in practically all branches of science. Its College of Medicine has won widespread recognition throughout the nation. The Graduate School has grown rapidly and has succeeded in gathering an outstanding group of scholars. On the campus is a fine athletic stadium for track and field events, as well as football, also a large field house, completed in 1939.

Situated in beautiful and picturesque Salt Lake City, the state capital, noted for its broad streets, fine residences, impressive public buildings and ideal climate, the University of Utah is singularly fortunate in its many natural advantages. Fortunate, indeed, also, is the student body who thus carry on their pursuit of higher learning in such delightful surroundings under the capable direction of an alert and progressive administration and faculty.
