

A handsome addition to Denver's Civic Center is the simple, yet architecturally beautiful City and County Building, completed in 1932 at a cost of five million dollars. It represents the joint design of thirty-five leading Denver architects, and its simple classic lines are a delight to the eye. Its slightly location with spacious and beautifully landscaped grounds adds to its charm and dignity.

The four-story granite building, with its concave facade of Doric columns, has a large central portico surmounted with a slender clock tower housing the Speer memorial chimes. The bronze doors of the main entrance are said to be among the largest ever cast. The interior paneling and massive columns in the lobby are of Colorado travertine.

The affairs of the City and County of Denver are carried on here and administered by a single set of officers.

On the fourth floor is the Denver Art Museum with twelve galleries of permanent exhibits and an art reference library maintained by the Denver Public Library. Exhibited are works of contemporary American artists, as well as a goodly number by some of the old masters.

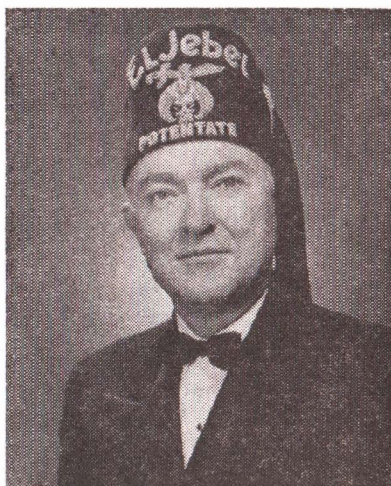
