The "Z-C" tour includes all of the features of the "C" tour described in this folder from arrival at Las Vegas, Nevada until the tour returns to Chicago. Combined with this are the principal features of our "Z" tour described fully in our Western Summer Tours book, available for the asking.

Briefly the "Z" tours leave Chicago on Saturday and on Monday morning arrive at Cedar City, Utah, starting point for a seven-day motor tour through the spectacular and beautiful Southern Utah-Arizona Wonderlands.

Two nights are spent at each — Zion, Grand Canyon and Bryce Canyon National Parks allowing ample time to explore and enjoy these gigantic, vividly colored masterpieces of nature. Added attractions are the Kaibab Forest and Cedar Breaks National Monument.

Upon returning to Cedar City Sunday evening, the ninth day, you travel independently overnight and in the morning, upon arrival at Las Vegas, join the "C" Tour for a comprehensive tour of California and Yosemite National Park.

Four national parks, a national monument, the interesting cities and other attractions visited, altogether make up a delightful vacation trip you will remember as one of the most interesting chapters in your life.

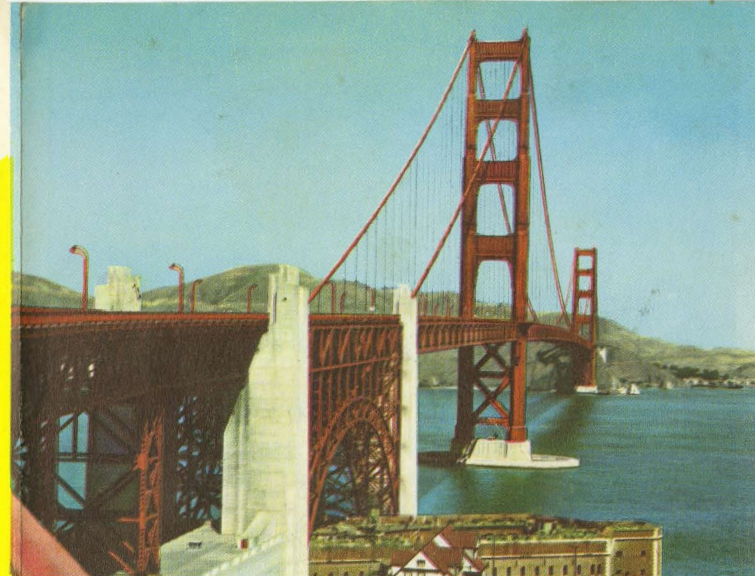

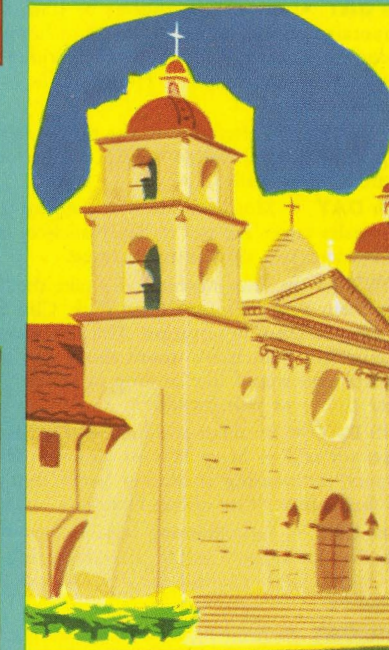

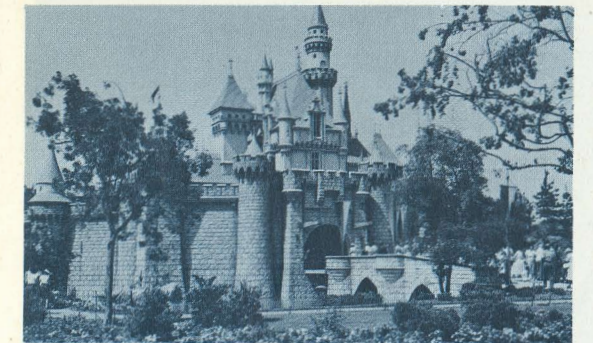

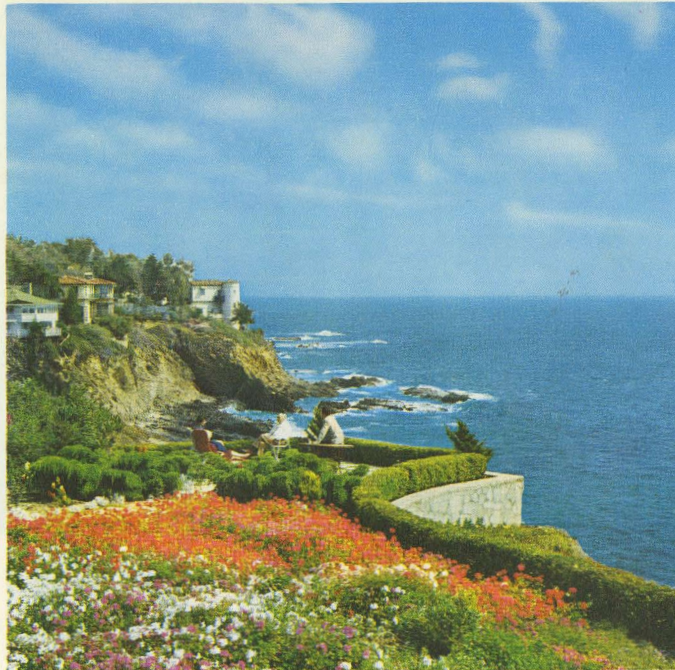

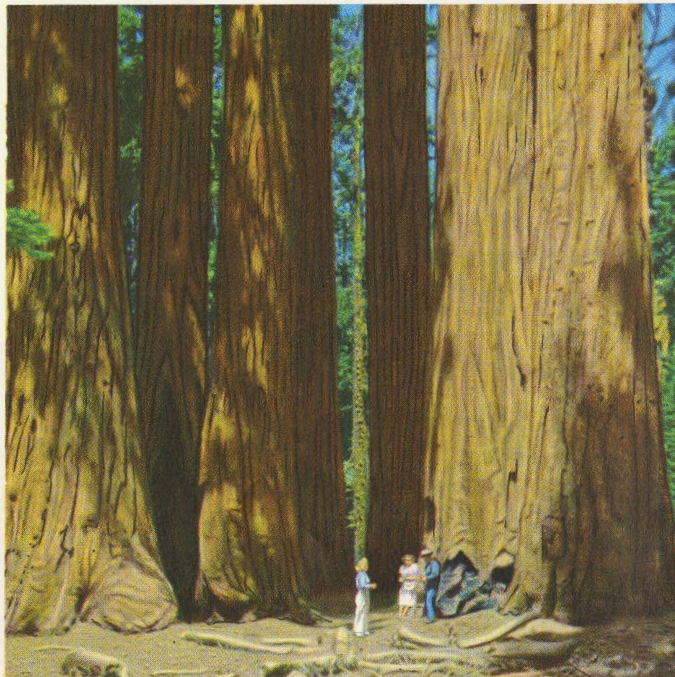
