







Shortly after the turn of the century, some of the ranches in the Union Pacific West began accepting "paying guests." MARCH Erosion, Mother Nature's tireless sculptor, carved Zion Canyon from the red and white sandstone cliffs of Southern Utah. Most famous of its beautiful rock temples is The Great White Throne, towering 2,475 feet above the river at its base. Nearby, in a parklike area surrounded by other mountain temples, is Zion Lodge with comfortable cabin accommodations.

APRIL Mount Rainier in Rainier National Park, Washington, rises to a height of 14,408 feet. Crowned with a halo of snow, Mount Rainier carries upon its shoulders 28 glaciers. Paradise Valley from which this view was taken is easily reached from Seattle or Tacoma.

Perched on the brink of the gorge at Bright Angel Point is Union Pacific's Grand Canyon Lodge which is surrounded on its other three sides by the beautiful Kaibab Forest. AUGUST This view of Hallett Peak from Nymph Lake in Rocky Mountain National Park is but one of Colorado's many combinations of beautiful lakes and peaks. It is the most mountainous state in the country with thousands of peaks that rise to a height of more than two miles above sea level. This popular national park is about seventy miles northwest of Denver, the mile-

high capital of Colorado. Denver is reached by fast over-night Union Pacific trains from Chicago or St. Louis, as well as by Domeliners and Streamliners from the West Coast.

It is easily reached from Las Vegas, Nevada, the "entertainment capital of the nation," when traveling to and from Southern California by Union Pacific.

This alpine-type village comprising Sun Valley Lodge, Challenger Inn, dormitory chalets, theater, shops, post office, Olympic size ice rink, is the "Mecca" for skiers the world over. 15th PAGE The Golden Gate Bridge is the longest single suspension span in the world. It links San Francisco with beautiful suburban cities in Marin County, Mt. Tamalpais and Muir Woods. To the north lies the famous Redwood Empire, to the south the peninsula cities of Burlingame, San Mateo, Palo Alto (home of Stanford University), San Jose, Carmel and Monterey.
