In this way, the railroad is doing everything possible to make the trip completely enjoyable for both parents and children. For real travel pleasure — go Union Pacific.


















# THE CHAIR GAR ATTENDANT





All Union Pacific engines are painted a bright yellow. There is a safety reason. Yellow can be seen from a longer distance than most other colors.







#### FAMILY FARE PLAN

NOTE TO ADULTS: Here is how the money-saving Family Fare Plan works on a one-way trip for two or more persons traveling in a family group. One adult—the husband, for example—pays the full one-way rail fare. The wife pays one-half the one-way rail fare. Children from the age of 12 to 22 also ride for half fare; from 5 to 12 years for one-quarter fare. Youngsters under age 5 travel free. Family fares also apply on round trips. Families traveling on this plan may check 300 pounds of baggage free in addition to hand luggage carried with them.

To take advantage of Union Pacific's family plan you board your train on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday. On round trips return can be made any day. This plan is good on all Union Pacific trains. Ask your ticket or travel agent to figure out the cost for *your* family group.
