

When Sun Valley opened its doors on Christmas 1936, for its first winter season, there was only the Lodge with accommodations for 250 guests, a single ski lift on Dollar Mountain, and five ski instructors. Today with Challenger Inn and the Chalets it can house 1,000 visitors, has eight electric chair lifts, and the largest ski school in America with over 60 instructors.

Sun Valley's summer facilities, too, have greatly expanded. Where once ice skating was limited to a winter natural rink there is a year-round, artificial, outdoor rink of Olympic size. There is now a beautiful and sporty 18-hole golf course instead of the former 9-holes.

But the finest of winter and summer sport facilities and accommodations is not the whole story. Equally important to Sun Valley's success has been the spirit of warmth and camaraderie, real western hospitality, which is the very heart of this resort's delightful atmosphere and charm. Most new guests are aware of this friendliness immediately upon registration, and many return year after year.

Sheltered in the winter by the high Sawtooth Mountains skiers find ideal terrain with long, timber-free ski runs, plenty of dry, powder snow and brilliant sunshine. Idaho is the third sunniest state in the nation and Sun Valley's summer activities are airconditioned by the snow-capped peaks of the surrounding mountains.

The winter season starts about December 20 and ends in early April. The summer season is from May 1 to Labor Day, with a fall closing date of around October 15.
