



Within the State of Colorado is a greater profusion of mountain scenery than can be found in any other comparable area in America. Furthermore it contains most of the 14,000-foot peaks of this country. Among names of wide fame are Pikes Peak, Longs Peak, Holy Cross Mountain and Mount Evans. Atop Lookout Mountain, near Denver, is the grave of W. F. Cody (Buffalo Bill), visited annually by many thousands of tourists.

The most noble grouping of these mountain masses is to be found in a compact area of about 400 square miles, some 70 miles northwest of Denver. This region, set aside as a national playground, is known as Rocky Mountain National Park. The famous Estes Park and Estes Park village are adjacent to its eastern entrance. Bear Lake, Dream Lake, Fern Lake and other mountain-rimmed bodies of water of similar beauty are found in its inner recesses.
