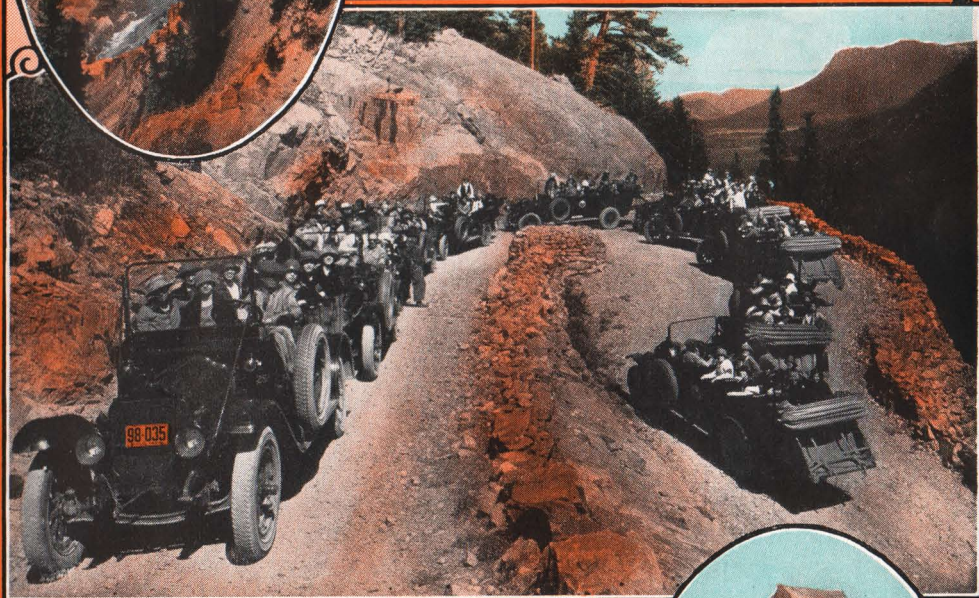

Baker).

Every detail of each tour is carefully planned in advance. Train riding is done in special Pullmans; hotel tables at stopover points are set and ready when meal time comes; a fleet of motor cars awaits us at hotel door and station platform; bags and suitcases disappear when they require carrying but turn up magically in your hotel; there are no meal checks presented; no bills at all to pay in fact; the best of everything is seen and done without having to ask directions, consult time tables, maps or guide books; no chance of wasting a day doing the wrong thing and missing something more worth while. Everything is planned in advance all the way through. An escort who is at once a guide and a business manager relieves everybody of all responsibilities. A lump sum paid in advance covers all necessary expenses from start to finish. You see the most, in the best way and with no waste of time.

The total cost is well within average means and really surprisingly low—probably materially less than would result if you made an independent trip under the pay-as-you-go plan.

## INFORMATION

The cost of each *Burlington Escorted Tour* covers all necessary expenses (except tips which we consider purely personal). There are no successive day-to-day payments. The lump sum paid in the beginning is the only cost anybody will be asked to pay.

It will be noted that the cost of a tour varies according to Pullman accommodations used and that the individual cost is less if two persons occupy one berth.

The total charge per person is based upon two persons to a room without bath at each hotel or lodge. There are two types of accommodation in Yellowstone Park—hotels and lodges. The hotels are great hostleries, modern in appointments and attractive as to architecture. The lodges are miniature villages of rustic buildings embracing community recreation halls, dining rooms where all have meals family style—surrounded by the groups of lodges which are the sleeping quarters.

Complete cost of each tour is shown herein both with and without railroad ticket. Passengers from east of Chicago and St. Louis should *purchase through railroad ticket at home station* and in that way secure full benefit of the reduction in summer excursion rate.

Holders of free railroad transportation are not taken on these tours.

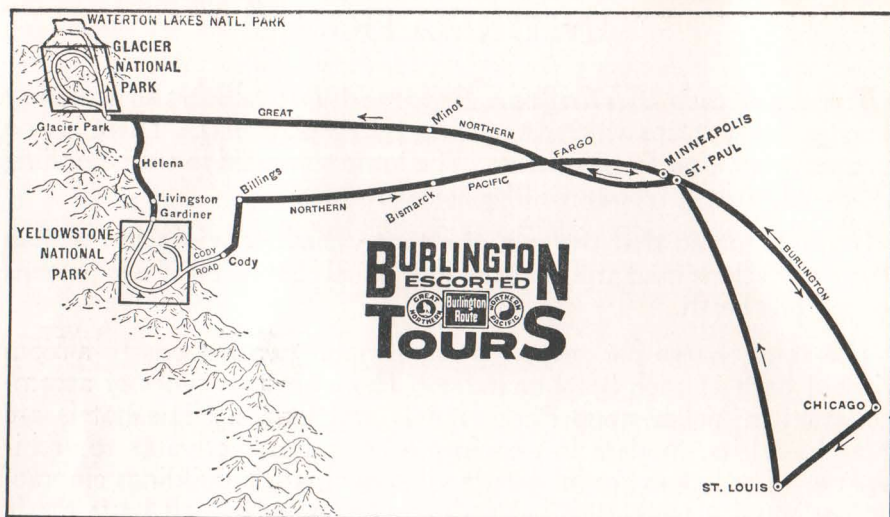

## GLACIER-YELLOWSTONE—TOUR A

14 DAYS

Every Saturday, June 16 to September 1, inclusive.

Leave Chicago 11:00 p.m.; leave St. Louis 2:15 p.m. on the Burlington for St. Paul and Minneapolis where motor sight-seeing trips are planned, thence westward through the ranch, grain, and Indian country of North Dakota and Montana, arriving Glacier National Park early Tuesday morning.

Two different tours are offered in Glacier Park: the *regular tour*, which takes in the Two-Medicine Valley, the Many-Glacier country, Going-to-the-Sun region and St. Mary Lake; or the *Canadian Tour*, including the Many-Glacier country, Prince of Wales Hotel in the New Waterton Lakes National Park in Canada, and Going-to-the-Sun region.

Then on to Yellowstone, stopping enroute at Helena for a trip by motor and launch to "the Gates of the Mountains" on the Missouri River.

A complete 5 day tour through "Wonderland"—entering at Gardiner and proceeding

through the Gardiner Canyon to Mammoth Hot Springs and the famous Tinted Terraces; then on via the Golden Gate and Norris Geyser Basin to the Old Faithful region for twenty-four golden hours. Hereabout are more geysers than in all the rest of the world. Then along the shore drive to the Yellowstone Lake Hotel or lodges for overnight and on the morrow to the world-famous Grand Canyon and Great Fall of the Yellowstone.

Leave Yellowstone over the Cody Road—famous 90 miles scenic motor highway, over Sylvan Pass, through the Buffalo Bill country, past the great government irrigation dam and through the breath-taking six-mile Shoshone Canyon.

Homeward through Montana, the Bad Lands of North Dakota, Minneapolis, St. Paul and along the Mississippi, reaching Chicago Saturday evening—St. Louis Sunday morning.

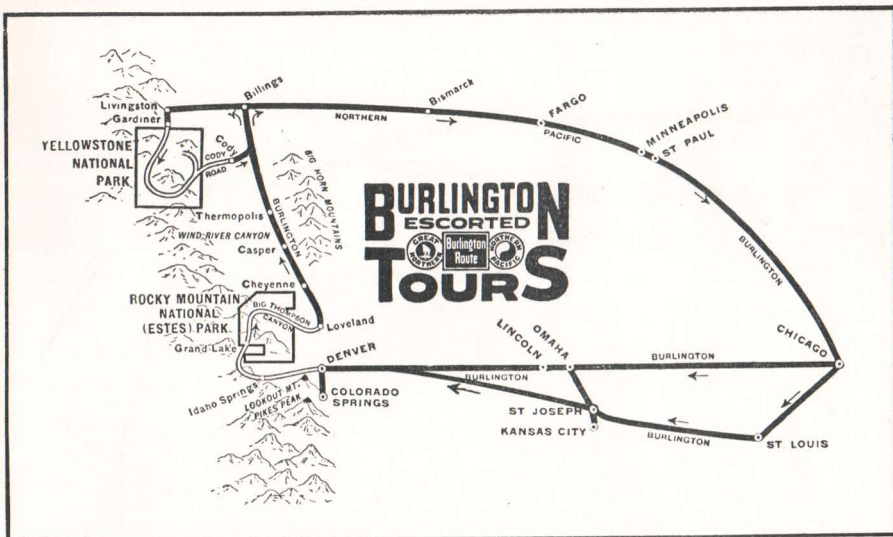

## COLORADO—YELLOWSTONE

TOUR B—13 DAYS. Every Thursday, June 14 to August 16, inclusive.

TOUR E—14 DAYS. { From Chicago, Every Saturday, June 16 to August 18, inclusive.  
 { From St. Louis, Every Sunday, June 17 to August 19, inclusive.

Circuit tours of unusual route embracing Rocky Mountain National (Estes) Park and magic Yellowstone, and in addition, the chief scenic attractions of the Denver and the Colorado Springs-Pikes Peak region. Both tours leave Chicago at 11:30 p.m.; the "B" Tour leaves St. Louis at 9:01 p.m. while the "E" Tour leaves St. Louis at 2:15 p.m.

The program provides for sight-seeing by motor in and about Denver, and then another day amid the scores of scenic allurements around Colorado Springs.

On Tour B two days, and on Tour E three days are given over to the Grand Circle Tour of Rocky Mountain National Park and its Alpine environs during which we twice cross the Continental Divide through passes high up in the mountains where snow lies the year around—a remarkable 200-mile motor trip embracing Denver's Mountain Parks, Lookout Mountain, Clear Creek Canyon, Idaho Hot Springs, Arapaho and Pike National Forests,

Berthoud Pass, Grand Lake, Milner Pass, the Fall River Road, Horseshoe Park, village of Estes Park and the great canyon of the Big Thompson River.

Then away through the Casper oil fields, the Wind River Canyon, and Thermopolis Hot Springs—between the Rockies on the west and the mighty Big Horns on the east—and so via Billings, Livingston, Paradise Valley and Gardiner Gateway to Yellowstone.

A complete five day tour through "Wonderland" among the greatest aggregation of geysers, hot springs, colored pools, mud volcanoes, hissing caverns, boiling caldrons, and other weird hot-water phenomena to be seen anywhere—and out of Yellowstone over the wonderful Cody Road—a ninety-mile motor trip which comes as a spectacular climax to a vacation tour on which we have made a grand circuit of the west and northwest with a varied route taking in a wide scope of territory and without any repetition in scenic aspects.

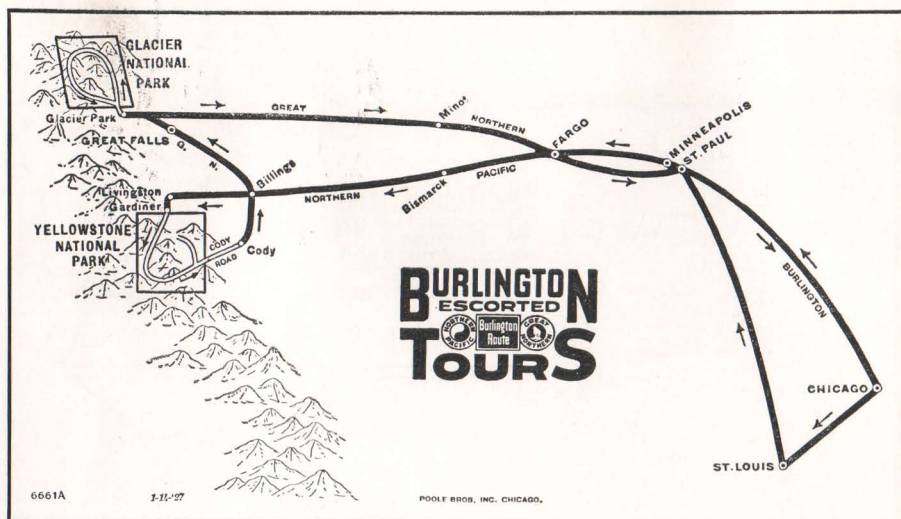

## YELLOWSTONE-GLACIER—TOUR C

14 DAYS

Every Monday, June 18 to August 20, inclusive.

Leave Chicago at 11:00 p.m. and St. Louis at 2:15 p.m. on the Burlington for St. Paul and Minneapolis, where we have a day of sight-seeing by motor, thence westward through the Bad Lands of North Dakota, the old Indian country and the vast ranch and grain sections of Montana.

A complete 5 day tour through Yellowstone entering at Gardiner and embracing all the chief points of scenic interest—the gorgeously tinted terraces at Mammoth Hot Springs, Norris Geyser Basin, Old Faithful Geyser Basin which includes the greatest aggregation of queer and unheard of hot water manifestations to be found anywhere in the world. A full twenty-four hours here before proceeding over the beautiful shore drive to the next stop on Yellowstone Lake and finally the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone and the Great Fall with special side trip to Dunraven Pass. Leaving Yellowstone over the Cody Road—thrilling 90 mile mountain motor highway leading over Sylvan Pass through the Dude Ranch country and the astonishing six mile gorge of the Sho-

shone River to Buffalo Bill's home town—Cody, Wyoming.

Then via Billings to Glacier Park with a stopover at Great Falls, Mont., for a motor trip to Rainbow Falls of the Missouri River.

The first day in Glacier is spent visiting the Blackfeet Indian camps, Two-Medicine Valley, Twin Falls and Trick Falls. Second day: morning motor trip to Many-Glacier Hotel for a twenty-four hour visit amid some of the most spectacular mountain grandeur on the continent. Choice of many diversions here—hiking, fishing, horseback trips or just resting. Third day: leave in the afternoon by motor for St. Mary Chalets then by launch on beautiful Lake St. Mary to Going-To-The-Sun Chalets at the foot of Going-To-The-Sun mountain. Fourth day: hike to Baring Falls and Sun Rift Gorge. Leave the "Sun" Chalets in the afternoon returning to Glacier Park Hotel.

Homeward through Montana, North Dakota, Minnesota, Minneapolis, St. Paul and alongside the Mississippi.

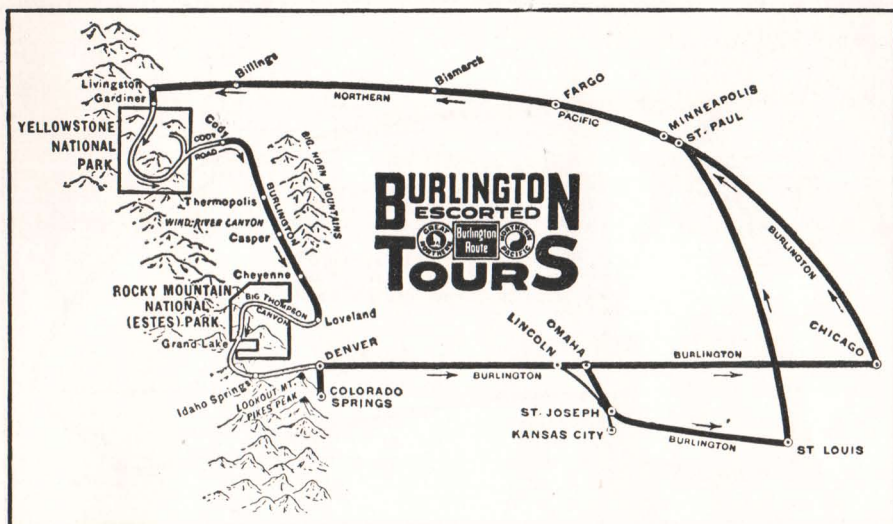

## YELLOWSTONE-COLORADO—TOUR D

**13 DAYS** Leaving Chicago every Sunday, June 17 to September 9, inclusive.  
Leaving St. Louis every Saturday, June 16 to September 8, inclusive.

This tour will leave Chicago 10:35 a. m., and St. Louis 2:15 p. m., making the big circuit in the reverse direction from that taken by Tours B and E.

Enter magic Yellowstone through the Gardiner Gateway Tuesday morning, making the complete 5 day tour through "Wonderland" and out of Yellowstone over the Cody Road—famous 90-mile scenic motor highway through the Buffalo Bill country via Sylvan Pass, Lake Eleanor, Shoshone National Forest, the Wyoming Dude Ranch regions, Shoshone Irrigation Dam and the mighty Canyon of the Shoshone River—the most scenic ninety miles in America.

The route from Cody leads through the Wind River Canyon, Thermopolis Hot Springs and Casper and enters Rocky Mountain National (Estes) Park via Loveland and the thrilling canyon of the Big Thompson River.

Follow three memorable days in which we make the entire two hundred mile grand circle tour, starting at the Estes Park Chalets, thence via the Fall River Road, over the snow on Fall River Pass and Milner Pass, alongside the head waters of the Colorado River, Grand Lake, crossing the Continental Divide at Berthoud Pass, through Idaho Hot Springs, Clear Creek Canyon, Denver's Mountain Parks, Lookout Mountain, and so to Denver for an afternoon and evening.

Then on to Colorado Springs, where we visit the Garden of the Gods, Seven Falls, take the famous Broadmoor-Cheyenne Mountain motor trip, and see the numerous other scenic attractions in which this region abounds, and as a grand climax ascend to the summit of America's foremost mountain—Pikes Peak.

Special Pullmans operating on special schedules permit us to make every hour count and make possible this fine combination tour in two week's time.

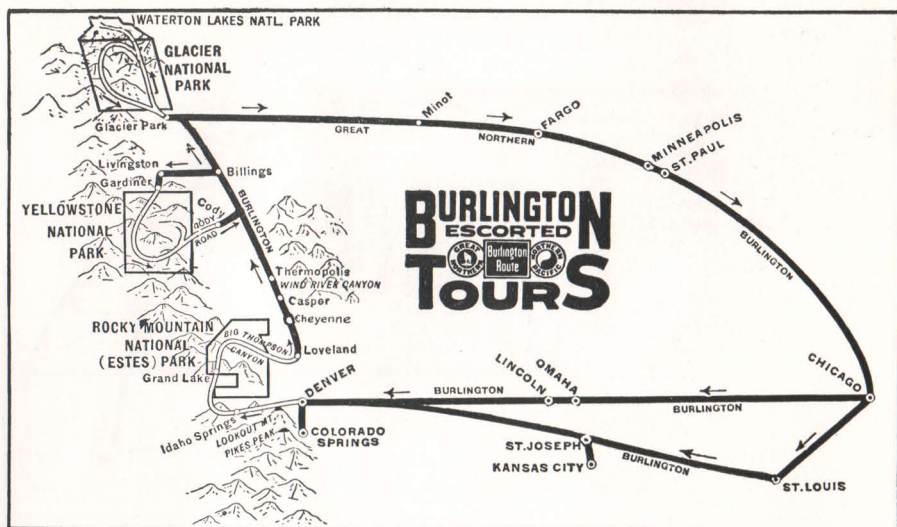

A 3-in-1 tour embracing Scenic Colorado, Rocky Mountain National (Estes) Park, Yellowstone Park, Glacier National Park and the Waterton Lakes National Park (in the Canadian Rockies)—a comprehensive Rocky Mountain circuit for those who have more than two weeks' time to devote to vacation purposes.

Leaving Chicago 11:30 p.m. and St. Louis 2:15 p.m. The route leads first to Denver and then to the Colorado Springs-Pikes Peak-Manitou region for a busy and interesting day, followed by a 3 day trip over the famous Rocky Mountain National Park Grand Circle Road via Denver's Mountain Parks. Lookout Mountain, Clear Creek Canyon, Idaho Hot Springs, Berthoud Pass, Grand Lake, Milner Pass, Fall River Road, Estes Park and the Big Thompson Canyon.

A complete 5 day tour through magic Yellowstone entering at Gardiner, Mont., visiting all the chief points of interest—the tinted terraces at Mammoth Hot Springs,

the weird phenomena of the Norris Geyser Basin, and the Old Faithful area, Yellowstone Lake, Grand Canyon and Great Fall, Dunraven Pass, and out to Cody over the thrilling 90 mile scenic mountain highway known as the Cody Road.

A 5 day tour in Glacier National Park—the land of shining mountains—visiting Black-foot Indian camps, Many-Glacier Hotel region, St. Mary Lake, Going-to-the-Sun Chalets and other scenic high spots too numerous to mention—including a day across the International border at the Prince of Wales Hotel in the new Waterton Lakes National Park in Canada.

The map shows the wide scope of territory encompassed by this Three-Park tour whose return route is through the old Indian country of eastern Montana, the ranch lands of North Dakota, Minnesota Lakes region, Minneapolis and St. Paul.

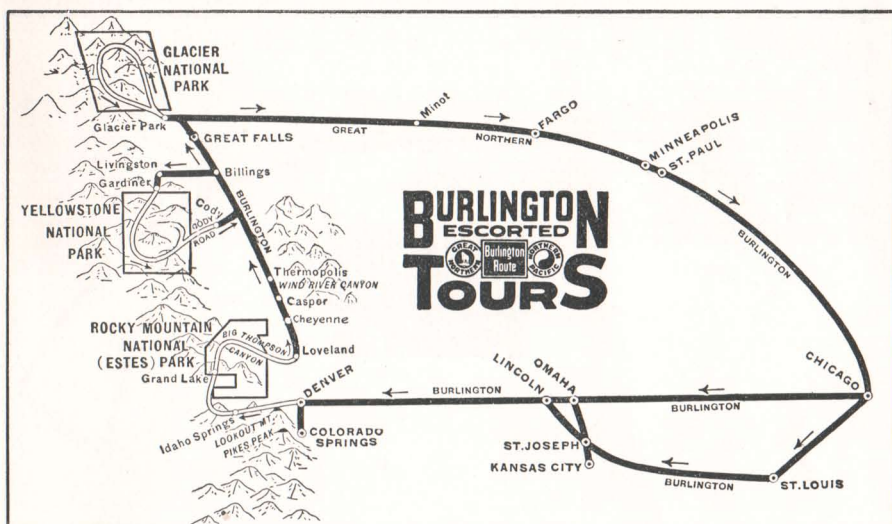

Every Thursday, June 14 to August 16, inclusive.

A popular combination tour embracing the chief scenic attractions around Denver, the Colorado Springs-Pikes Peak Region, Rocky Mountain National (Estes) Park and environs, five days in magic Yellowstone and 4 days in the mountain world of Glacier National Park—much like tour F but requiring only 18 days and costing materially less.

The program provides for a full day of sight-seeing by motor in and about Denver, and then another day amid the scores of scenic allurements in the Colorado Springs-Manitou-Pikes Peak region.

Two more days are given over to the Grand Circle Tour of Rocky Mountain National Park and its Alpine environs, during which we twice cross the Continental Divide through passes high up in the mountains where snow lies the year round—a remarkable 200-mile motor trip embracing Denver's Mountain Parks, Lookout Mountain, Clear Creek Canyon, Idaho Hot Springs, Arapaho and Pike National Forests, Berthoud Pass, Grand Lake, Milner Pass, the Fall River Road, Horseshoe Park, village of Estes Park and the great canyon of the Big Thompson River.

Four wonderful days in Glacier National Park with sightseeing in the Two-Medicine Lakes country, Glacier Park Hotel, St. Mary Lake, Going-to-the-Sun area, the lake and glacier country around the Many-Glacier Hotel—a memorable experience amid mountain grandeur unsurpassed in the world.

Homeward through Montana, North Dakota, Minnesota, Minneapolis, St. Paul and alongside the Mississippi.

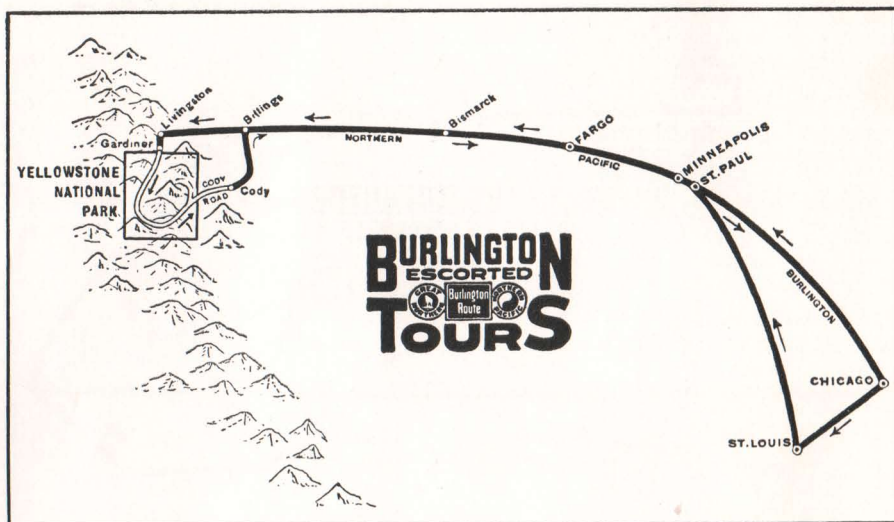

## YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK—TOUR H

9 DAYS.

Leaving Chicago Sunday, June 17 to August 26, inclusive.

Leaving St. Louis Saturday, June 16 to August 25, inclusive.

Designed for those desiring to visit Yellowstone only, and having but a brief time in which to do so.

Leaving Chicago at 10:35 a.m. and St. Louis at 2:15 p.m. and starting with a pleasant daylight ride along the scenic shore of the Mississippi River on the way to St. Paul and Minneapolis; then westward through the Bad Lands of North Dakota and Roosevelt National Park to Yellowstone.

Entering the Park at Gardiner we proceed through Gardiner Canyon to Mammoth Hot Springs. Afternoon hiking trip over the Terrace formations with perhaps a plunge in the open pool of geyser water.

Leave Mammoth and proceed through Golden Gate, past Obsidian Cliff, walk across the Norris Geyser basin, stop for a few moments at the Excelsior Geyser Basin, arriving Old Faithful at noon. Within easy walking distance we find the greatest aggregation of geysers in the world together with hundreds of other queer and unheard of hot water phenomena.

After twenty-four hours at Old Faithful we proceed to Yellowstone Lake, which ranks among the world's large lakes in point of elevation. Overnight here. (A good place to get acquainted with the bears which live in the forest in this vicinity.)

Leave the Lake at 9:00 a.m. going direct to Artist Point or Inspiration Point for our first view of the majestic Great Fall and the Painted Canyon of the Yellowstone. Afternoon hikes along the canyon rim and to the foot of the falls.

At 9:00 a.m. we leave Canyon for the trip out of the park over the wonderful 90-mile Cody Road, which crosses the Absaroka Mountains at Sylvan Pass, then runs on through the Buffalo Bill country, following the Shoshone River to the great irrigation dam, and through the six-mile Shoshone Canyon to Cody where our return rail journey commences.

Returning through Billings, Minneapolis and St. Paul, along the Mississippi River for three hundred miles, arriving Chicago Monday evening and St. Louis Tuesday morning.

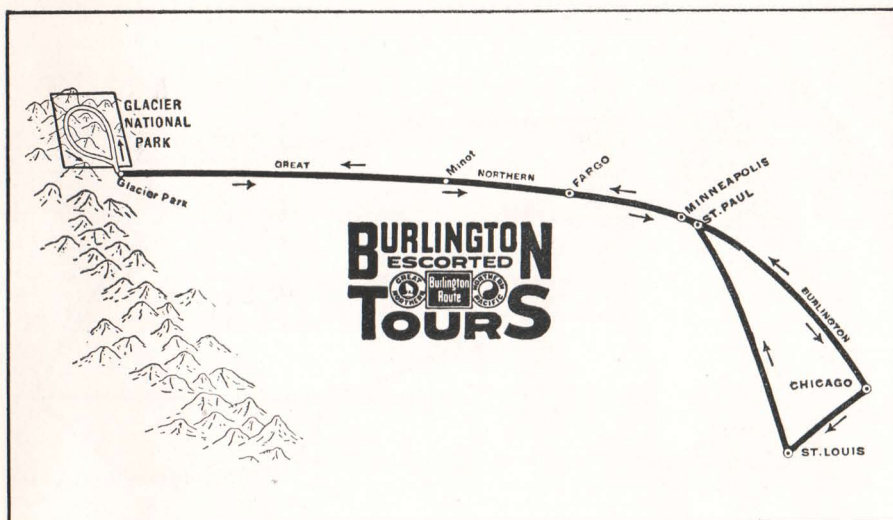

## GLACIER NATIONAL PARK—TOUR J

9 DAYS

Every Saturday, June 23 to August 25, inclusive

Tour J makes possible a fine vacation in Glacier National Park for those having but a limited time.

Leave Chicago 11:00 p.m., St. Louis 2:15 p.m. Along the shore of the Mississippi River for three hundred miles enroute to St. Paul and Minneapolis where a sight-seeing trip by motor is planned to include the principal places of scenic and historic interest in the Twin Cities. Then Westward through the ranch, grain and Indian country of North Dakota and Montana, arriving Glacier Park 8:05 a.m. Tuesday. During this day we visit the Blackfeet Indian Camp, have an auto trip to the Two-Medicine valley with a boat ride on Two-Medicine Lake followed by a trail hike to see Twin Falls. Entertainment by Indians on the hotel veranda tonight.

Leave Glacier Park Hotel Wednesday morning for the fifty-five mile motor ride to Many-Glacier Hotel where we spend two days in the heart of the mountain world.

Many-Glacier Hotel is located on the shore of Lake McDermott and is the starting point for any number of hikes and horseback trips into the mountains. Or if you desire you may spend your time fishing, boating or just resting and loafing.

Leave the Many-Glacier Hotel Friday afternoon for the Going-to-the-Sun region using motor to St. Mary Landing thence boat to the upper end of St. Mary Lake where the famed "Sun" Chalets perch on a rocky ledge like an eagle's nest, commanding a view of alpine beauty that defies description.

Saturday morning hiking trips to Sun Rift Gorge and Baring Falls and after luncheon leave for a 12-mile launch trip to St. Mary Chalets where we transfer to autos for the Glacier Park Hotel.

Home over the Great Northern Railway through Eastern Montana, North Dakota, Minnesota, Minneapolis, St. Paul and along the Mississippi.

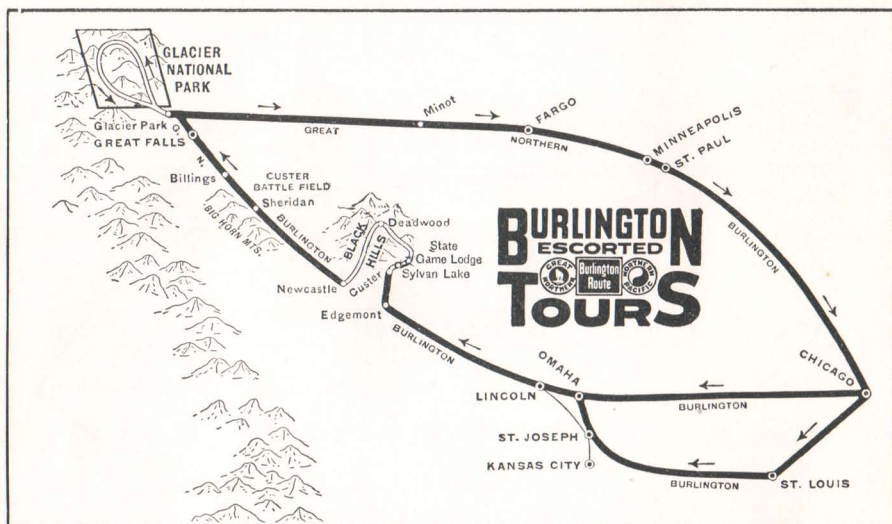
