The 1935 ARISTOCRAT is the 48th annual edition of the oldest long-distance train in America; and the leader of the Burlington fleet that includes several of the finest trains in the world.

It operates over the main line of this railroad between Chicago and Denver - 1034 miles.

The Aristocrat is really three trains. As one Aristocrat is leaving Chicago in the forenoon its exact counterpart is nearing Denver, and a third Aristocrat is rushing eastward through Iowa on its way to Chicago.

Thus three complete trains - all exactly alike - are required to perform this crack service, and their regular equipment involves about forty cars, although during the summer vacation season the average runs as high as fifty cars.

Its matched Pullmans, done in pearl-green with rose undertone, and superbly appointed throughout, offer the quiet elegance of the town club . . deep-cushioned, winged seats, lazily restful . . . colorful rugs of Oriental splendor to soften the footfall . . . mellow lights and individual reading lamps . . . spacious dressing rooms to make the morning toilette a refreshing pleasure.

Window frames are of solid brass; the plate glass panes are cushioned in live rubber to preclude annoying squeak or rattle; window ventilators are adjustable by a mere touch; aisle rugs cover the vestibule platforms between cars.

Between the two are the barber shop and shower bath.

THE CHAIR CAR (Air-conditioned)

A new and ultra-modern type of chair car. Notice that the chairs can be turned to face the windows. The chair cars are wired for radio. The seats are free.
