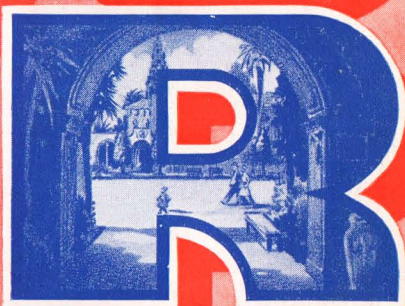
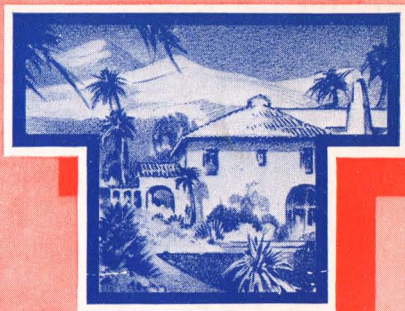
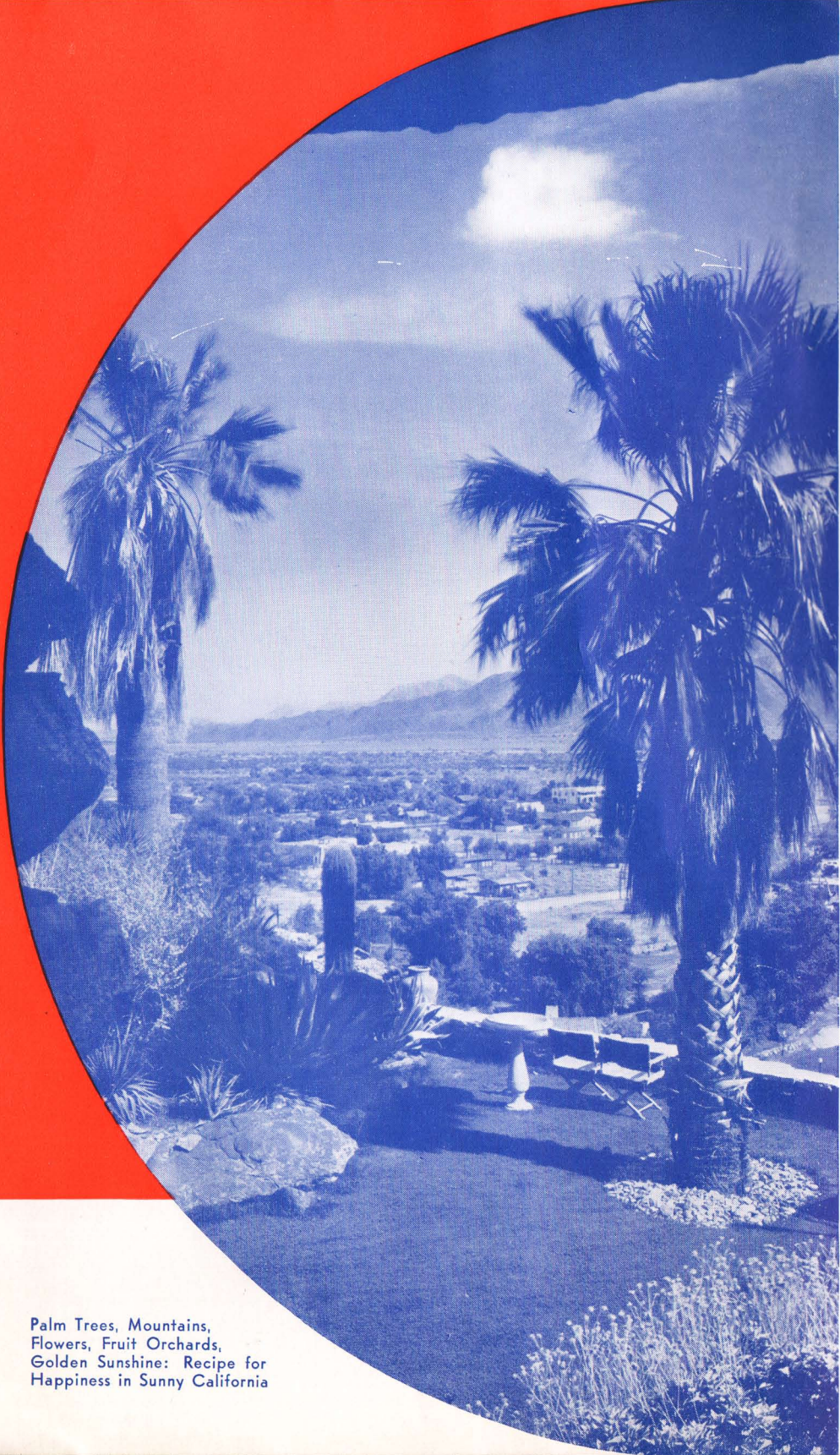

During the next four days our program includes only one scheduled event, a delightful motor tour Thursday morning to Hollywood, Beverly Hills and other interesting points. All the rest of the time is ours to enjoy as we see fit . . . visiting unique places, getting close-ups of famous screen stars, sharing their night life and eating in the famous restaurants they frequent. So that we may indulge these personal pleasures to the utmost, without additional expense, our tour includes no meals while in Los Angeles.

Ar. Los Angeles.....12:30 P.M.....Santa Fe

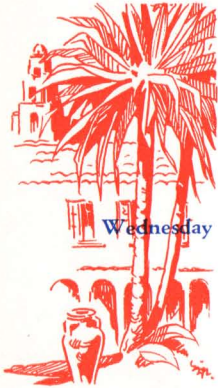

With headquarters established at the fine Benjamin Franklin Hotel, we lose no time in making the most of our final day in the good old "States" before we sail. Most of our remaining hours are left open for individual pleasure, except for a motor tour Sunday afternoon.

Monday

The gangplank is up, the whistle sounds, and we're off on the *S. S. Aleutian* for Alaska, with ten days of thrilling adventure in and around Uncle Sam's own foreign land ahead of us. Our voyage takes us via the "Inside Passage," between islands and mainland, where the sheltered waters offer a delightfully restful cruise free from "the landlubber's curse": seasickness.

Fascinating shore excursions on our way north are made at Ketchikan and Wrangel where the totem poles "grow," at Petersburg and Juneau, redolent with Indian lore and rich in romance and story, and at Taku Glacier's mighty river of ice.

Friday morning finds us in Skagway, the gateway city to the wilderness of the Yukon territory. From here a tremendously thrilling side trip by train can be made over White Pass to Lake Bennett over the famous "Trail of '98" of gold rush days. Additional cost for this side trip is only \$8.50.

Friday

The return trip to Seattle takes us over much the same route except that Sitka, the most interesting city in Alaska, is added to our shore leaves. In the very early days of Northwest settlement when Russia owned this territory, Sitka was the capital of her Alaskan domain. The quaint old church and many of those picturesque early homes still stand as they did years ago when Alaska was only a wilderness.

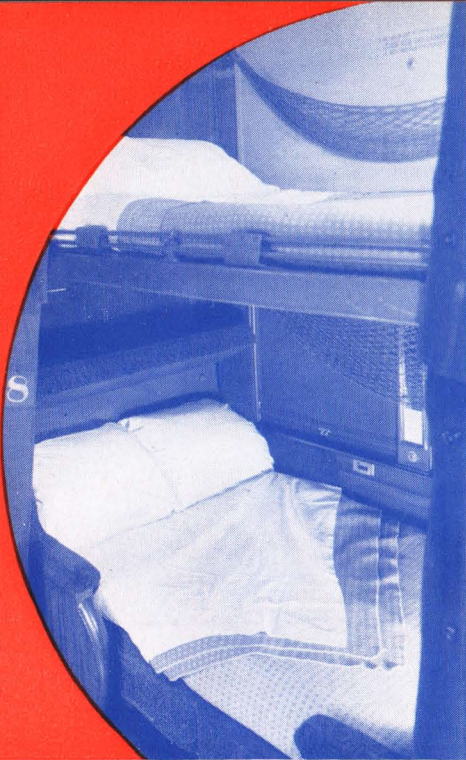

Pullman Tourist Cars

Tourist Sleepers are used on the Bargain Tours described in this booklet. In case you do not know what a Tourist Sleeper is, let it be said that these are high-grade Pullman cars in every way. A little less modern than cars designated as Pullman Standard Sleepers, they are not air conditioned (except as noted under Tours X and XW) but have the same travel conveniences . . . seats by day and berths by night, clean, fresh bed linens, comfortable mattresses, ice water on tap, dressing rooms, electric lighting, and porter service the same as Standard cars. The main difference is that Tourist Sleeper accommodations are offered at reduced rates that represent unusual values in summer vacation travel.

Meals in Los Angeles

To insist that our tour guests eat all meals in one place while in Los Angeles would be an imposition. Many have friends or relatives there with whom they will want to have several meals. Others will seek out the better known restaurants where the movie stars gather to sup and be admired. Still others will be "on the go" so constantly as to have time only for a bite on the run. For these reasons our tours do not include meals while we stop in Los Angeles. Excellent restaurants, cafeterias and coffee shops abound where one can eat very well for only \$1.50 to \$2.00 per day. Even at the "swankier," more expensive places, prices are quite reasonable.

Apparel and Baggage

Weather on these tours is almost universally warm, therefore we would suggest lightweight sport outfits for day wear, with comfortable shoes for walking and, of course, change of costume for dinner and evening pleasures (not formal attire). It would be well also to have cold cream for sunburn and chapped lips.

We would also suggest one medium-sized traveling bag as being sufficient for a tour of two weeks or less. Trunks are unnecessary.

How to Extend Your Tour
