× Nature's Giants

On the western slopes of the Sierra Nevada Mountains in Central California are found the oldest living things on earth, the Sequoia trees . . . patriachs of the plant world.

Standing serene and primal in their majesty, many of these aged monarchs of the forest had their beginning centuries before the pyramids of Egypt were built. Scientists have estimated that the largest of them are probably about 4,000 years old.

It is difficult for the imagination to grasp the immense size of these lofty sentinels. The General Sherman Tree, biggest and oldest living thing, is 280 feet high, with a diameter of 36.5 feet. The Keystone State Tree reaches 326 feet toward the sky; the "Empire State" is 94 feet in circumference; the "William McKinley" is 290 feet high, with a diameter of 28 feet; the "Abraham Lincoln" has attained a height of 270 feet and a diameter of 31 feet. The famed Wawona Tree in Yosemite National Park, standing square across a roadway, has been cut through at the base and transformed into an archway through which large motor buses can easily be driven. One of the world's most unique dancing pavilions is the result of polishing the surface of the stump of a single gigantic specimen. The bark grows to an average thickness of twelve inches, although quite often an old tree is covered with bark two feet thick.

Distinguished in the family of Sequoias are the Giant Redwoods, found in great abundance on the Pacific side of the Coast Range in California and Southern Oregon. The redwoods grow to an enormous size, heights of 300 feet or more being quite common. In one instance, a church was built entirely from the wood of one great redwood tree.

This species produces the most valuable lumber to be found west of the Rocky Mountains. The light, durable wood takes a beautiful satiny finish and is used extensively for woodwork in houses. Fancy furniture and bric-a-brac are made from curly-grained redwood.

Unlike many other types of trees, the redwoods are able to grow from stump sprouts, so that with careful management the great redwood forests may be perpetuated for generations to come.
