Vista Dome Car Is Rail 'Plus' Service

A ride in one of the new Vista Dome cars now in regular day service on the Burlington between Chicago and the Twin Cities certainly gives one a reminder of how much more the railroads are giving the coach passenger for his money than ever before. It isn't only a case of throwing in at no extra cost a species of observation car privileges heretofore restricted to Pullman ticket holders. The Vista Dome gives the passenger a "kind" of ride which he has never had before at any price.

You ride just high enough to miss most unsightly things along the tracks and yet low enough to get a keen vision of trees, rivers, roads, houses and other objects of interest.

But the most outstanding thing about these dome cars is their unusual quietness. That feature gives the dome rider an unusual sense of gliding through the air. You hear very little of the track and truck noises.

Provide Extra Passenger Space

Each Vista Dome has 24 seats which are not reserved. There are enough dome compartment seats on the Twin Cities Zephyrs so that each passenger has an allotment of his regular car seat and one-half a dome seat. This feature, according to Albert Cotsworth, Burlington Passenger Traffic Manager, is greatly appreciated by passengers. Freedom to move about on the Vista Dome trains eliminates any monotony of train travel, Cotsworth added.


Besides giving coach passengers a superior observation car privilege there are fewer seats per car on the main floor. This means more main floor space per passenger.

The cars are 85 feet long. Budd Manufacturing Co., the builders, points out that the top of the dome car is only one foot four inches higher than in standard cars. The first Vista Dome carwas put in service by the Burlington in 1945. It's popularity resulted in the road ordering 40 such cars.



The Vista-Dome

Built into the roofs of the coaches and the parlor-observation car, each dome has 24 deep-cushioned seats enclosed in non-glare, heat-resistant safety glass, from which passengers have an unobstructed view. These seats are not reserved, so all passengers may enjoy this treat.

Camera fans find the dome a marvelous place from which to photograph the enchanting scenery along the Mississippi River. Best results are secured by using twice the normal exposure.



Completely new stainless steel California Zephyrs are to be placed in service between Chicago, Denver, Sall Lake City and San Francisco late in 1948 (replacing the Exposition Flyer). Each Zephyr will feature three coaches, a buffet Jounge car, and a lounge-observation car all equipped with the popular Vista Domes, from which passengers will thrill to the glarious scenery at the Colorado Rockies and California's Feather River Canyon. Sleeping cars will contain a variety of accommodations. Colorful dining car for all meals.

Burlington introduced the first Vista-Dome in July, 1945, and in December, 1947, placed in service between Chicago and St. Paul-Minneapolis the new TWIN ZEPHYRS—the first regular trains ever to be equipped with Vista-Dome cars.

Each Twin Zephyr has four spacious coaches and a luxurious parlor-observation car with Vista-Domes, a colorful diner, and a beautifully-appointed club-lounge.
