

PERSONAL TIPS

Where tips have been included in any of these tours, that item will be shown under "Tour costs includes".

YOUR APPAREL AND BAGGAGE

Always Travel Light but Comfortably! On Mountain Park tours, while these are summer journeys the nights in the mountains and the cool invigorating auto rides make desirable mediumweight wraps, sweater coats or a wind and weatherproof outer coat. Slacks and outing suits are worn throughout the mountain territory. Stout sports shoes or boots should be part of your outfit. On Pacific Coast tours, with the weather almost universally warm, lightweight sports outfits are most appropriate for day wear, plus comfortable walking shoes.

After the day's activities, the dinner hour and evening lounge or dance natually suggest a change from the habiliments of travel and outdoor life. While formal evening attire is entirely unnecessary, it is desirable to carry informal dinner clothes.

One medium-sized suitcase or traveling bag should hold sufficient clothing for any tour of two weeks or less.

In any case trunks are unnecessary.Due to frequent handling - durable baggage with strong handles is essential.

Because of the change of climate and of mountain altitudes it's advisable to include cold cream and the usual lotions for sunburn and chapped lips. The usual bright sunlight also suggests you bring colored glasses.


LIABILITY
