

St. Paul Winter Carnival Ice Castle Tom Tschida, Equipment Services, AAR Billing department St. Paul, Minnesota



Ready for Action Michael D. Sawyer, Conductor Seattle, Washington



Coal Train Near Northport, Nebraska Albert J. Pfeiffer, Jr., Brakeman/Conductor Alliance, Nebraska



Freight Train at the Spokane River Mike Gelhaus, Locomotive Engineer Spokane, Washington






