

CANADA leads the world in the manufacture of pulp and paper. In all the great centres of Europe and America, magazines, newspapers and books are being printed daily on the products of Canadian mills.

In 1928, 110 Canadian mills produced 3,610,724 tons of pulp and 2,849,687 tons of paper with a total market value of \$233,535,326. During the same period the value of pulp and paper exports was \$147,156,792.

The transportation facilities afforded by the railway, steamship and express services of the Canadian Pacific contribute largely to the pre-eminence enjoyed by this stupendous Canadian industry.
