

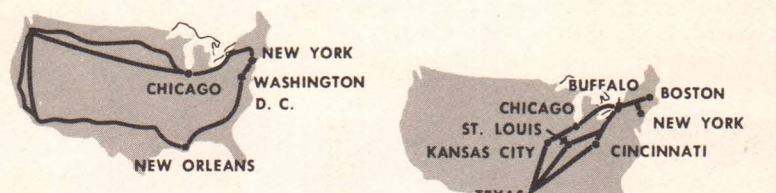
Highlights of ALL-AMERICAN Rail Travel

Go one way... RETURN ANOTHER

Four typical examples of alternate routes available on round trip tickets. See your local agent today for

fares and information on these and many other alternate routes throughout the East, South and West.

1 BETWEEN EAST AND WEST—For about the same bargain fare of the most direct coast-to-coast round-trip, you can start from almost anywhere in the East, visit the Pacific Northwest, travel down through California and return across the Southwest to the Gulf Coast... or make variations within this circle. Do this, too, in a 2-week vacation.



2 BETWEEN EAST AND SOUTHWEST—On travel between Eastern points and Kansas City, Oklahoma and Southwestern areas... go one way via Chicago, the other via St. Louis. In many cases, go one way via Chicago or St. Louis, the other way via Cincinnati.

3 BETWEEN EAST, MIDWEST AND SOUTH—On trips between the East and the Gulf Coast, and lower Mississippi Valley, travel via Chicago or St. Louis or Cincinnati. On trips between the Midwest and Florida points, travel direct through Cincinnati or via St. Louis, New Orleans, etc.



4 CANADA AND MEXICO ON COAST-TO-COAST ROUND-TRIPS—Include British Columbia coastal cities, Lake Louise and Banff on transcontinental round-trips for only \$7.00 extra plus tax... Mexico City via a choice of routes... enter one gateway, leave by another... for approximately \$60.00 extra, plus tax, on your transcontinental ticket.

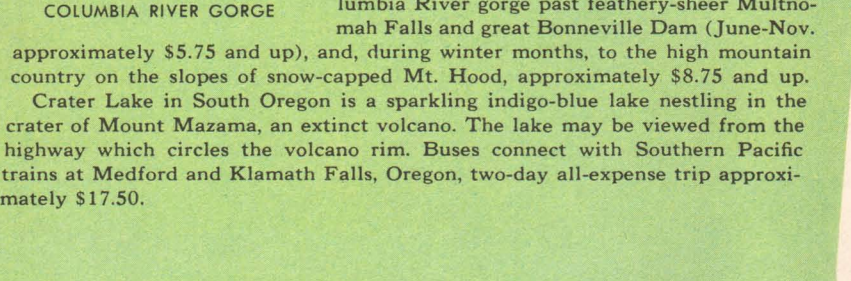
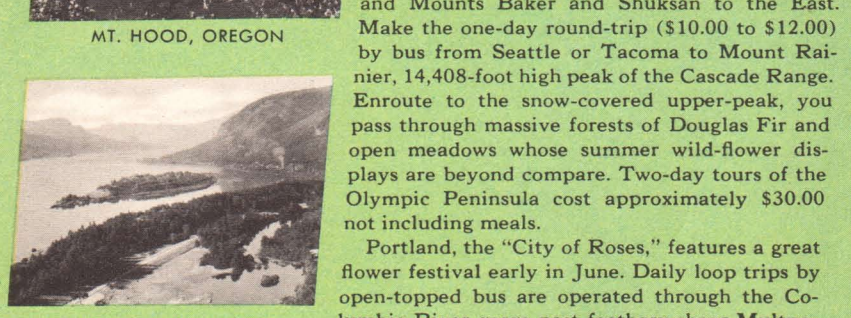

- ★ Side trip to Niagara Falls from Buffalo on many long-distance tickets.
 - ★ Stopovers of points enroute can be arranged by your train conductor.
 - ★ Travel via Washington, D. C., one way, on many round-trip tickets between the East and Midwest.
 - ★ Exchange tickets on round trips between Boston and the West, for travel one way via New York City.
 - ★ CHOICE OF FOUR ROUTES EAST-WEST. Tickets reading via N. Y. C. R. R. between Chicago, Ill. and Albany, N. Y., will be honored via Ann Arbor and St. Thomas or via Elkhart and Cleveland or via Indianapolis, Marion and Cleveland or via Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Columbus and Cleveland or vice versa.
 - ★ SIDE TRIP TO PITTSBURGH, PA. Tickets reading via N. Y. C. R. R. between Albany and Chicago or points beyond may be exchanged at Ticket Offices to read via N. Y. C. R. R., Youngstown, P. & L. E. R. R., Pittsburgh, Pa., P. & L. E. R. R., Youngstown, Erie R. R., Cleveland and N. Y. C. R. R. (via Elkhart), or vice versa.
 - ★ Round-trip tickets between St. Louis, Mo. and Buffalo, N. Y. or points beyond, reading via G. M. & O. R. R., Ill. Cent. R. R. or Wab. Ry., Chicago, Ill., thence, N. Y. C. R. R. (via Cleveland or St. Thomas), will be honored via N. Y. C. R. R. (via Bellefonte or Cincinnati) and Cleveland or Toledo or via Bellefonte or Cincinnati and Toledo, Detroit and St. Thomas, or vice versa.
 - ★ One-way and round-trip tickets reading via N. Y. C. R. R. between Cincinnati, Ohio and Buffalo, N. Y., or points beyond will be honored via Columbus and Cleveland or via Forest, Toledo and Cleveland or via Forest, Toledo and St. Thomas or vice versa—except for or from New York, N. Y., and stations south of Albany upon reduced round-trip fare tickets only.
 - ★ Passengers desiring to use N. Y. C. R. R. in one direction and B. & O. R. R. or P. R. R. in the opposite direction between Cleveland, Columbus, Cincinnati, Ohio, Detroit, Mich., or points west thereof and New York, N. Y., may purchase round-trip tickets via actual route of travel to and from New York, N. Y.
 - ★ Round-trip tickets between points on and south of the line of the N. Y. C. R. R. to St. Louis, inclusive and New York, N. Y., may be routed in one direction via Cincinnati or Louisville, C. & O. Ry., Washington, thence B. & O. R. R. or P. R. R., and in the other direction via N. Y. C. R. R.

THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST—In British Columbia, view the Stanley Park floral displays and the peak-surrounded harbor of Vancouver. Enjoy the hospitality of magnificent hotels set amidst flower-trimmed lawns at Victoria on Vancouver Island—a "breath of England!"

Cruise Puget Sound by daylight—see Norwegian fjord scenery in America, as you pass the snow-capped peaks of the Olympics to the West and Mounts Baker and Shuksan to the East. Make the one-day round-trip (\$10.00 to \$12.00) by bus from Seattle or Tacoma to Mount Rainier, 14,408-foot high peak of the Cascade Range. Enroute to the snow-covered upper-peak, you pass through massive forests of Douglas Fir and open meadows whose summer wild-flower displays are beyond compare. Two-day tours of the Olympic Peninsula cost approximately \$30.00 not including meals.

Portland, the "City of Roses," features a great flower festival early in June. Daily loop trips by open-topped bus are operated through the Columbia River gorge past feathery-sheer Multnomah Falls and great Bonneville Dam (June-Nov. approximately \$5.75 and up), and, during winter months, to the high mountain country on the slopes of snow-capped Mt. Hood, approximately \$8.75 and up. Crater Lake in South Oregon is a sparkling indigo-blue lake nesting in the crater of Mount Mazama, an extinct volcano. The lake may be viewed from the highway which circles the volcano rim. Buses connected with Southern Pacific trains at Medford and Klamath Falls, Oregon, two-day all-expense trip approximately \$17.50.



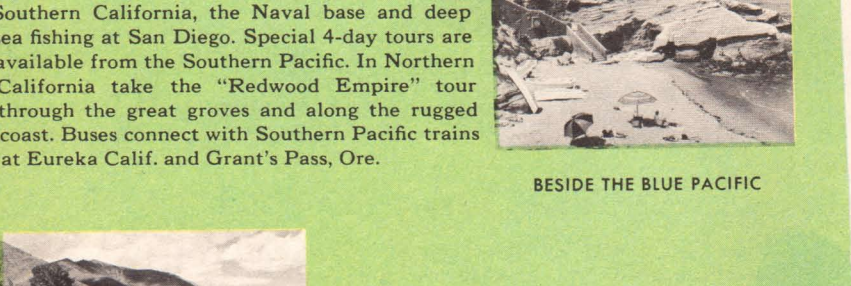
CANADIAN ROCKIES—Lake Louise is a charming mountain-lake resort set in a backdrop of snow-capped peaks. At nearby Banff see the same mountain peaks, enjoy all outdoor sports, accommodations and service by Canadian Pacific. Jasper National Park near the mighty Columbia ice fields is delightfully located astride the Continental Divide. Service and reservations by the Canadian National.



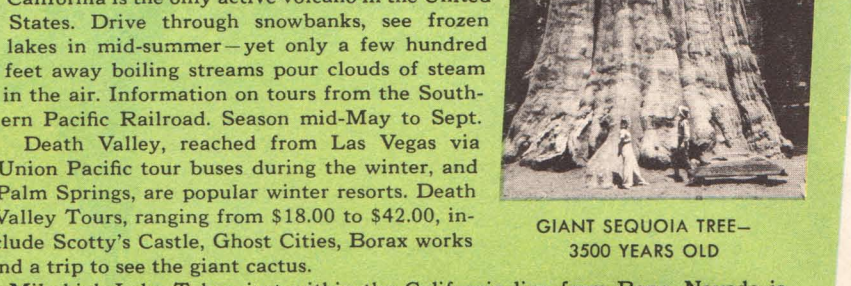
YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK—Glacier-carved Yosemite Valley's walls rise a sheer mile above the valley floor in impressive majesty. The filmy spray of Bridal Veil Falls' 3500-foot drop and the early-summer volume of tremendous 2500-foot Yosemite Falls are unforgettable sights. There are miles of walks, bicycle and bridal paths and several groves of Giant Sequoia trees. Yosemite buses connect with Santa Fe and Southern Pacific trains at Fresno in the summer and Merced in the winter. Allow two days minimum time. All-Expense Tours from approximately \$25.00 and up are available from your ticket agent.



SAN FRANCISCO—Fascinating seaport city surrounded by great bays and two of the world's largest bridges... Golden Gate with a clear 4200-foot span and The Bay Bridge to Oakland, 4 1/2 miles long. Of particular interest are the cable cars, Chinatown, Golden Gate Park, the shipping-studded Embarcadero and Fisherman's Wharf, Harbor Boat Trips.



LOS ANGELES—The center of a vast tourist and resort area. Nearby are gay Hollywood and the movie studios; ocean beaches at Redondo Beach, Long Beach and Santa Monica; oil fields with "sea-going" derricks; cruise boats to Santa Catalina Island; reconstructed Gold Rush town, stage coaches and narrow gauge railroad at Knott's Berry Farm. Downtown on Olvera Street and many fine parks, hotels, amusement spots. Tours are available to all points.

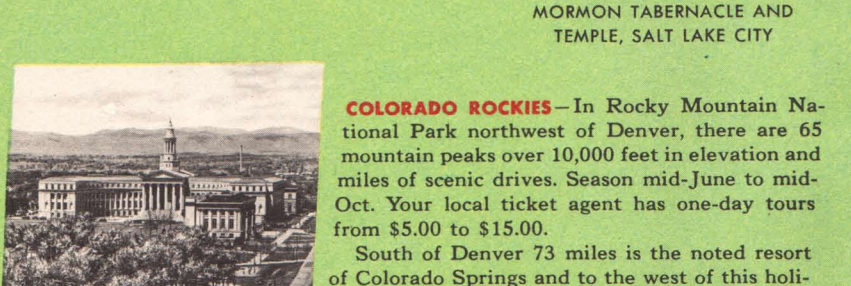


CALIFORNIA SEACOAST—Marvel at the famous Spanish Missions along the entire coast, the bright-berthed fishing fleet at Monterey, the art colony at Carmel, the flower-covered cliffs in Southern California, the Naval base and deep sea fishing at San Diego. Special 4-day tours are available from the Southern Pacific. In Northern California take the "Redwood Empire" tour through the great groves and along the rugged coast. Buses connect with Southern Pacific trains at Eureka, Calis, and Grant's Pass, Ore.



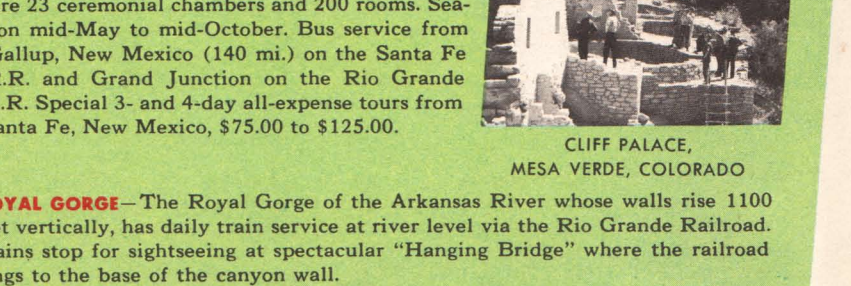
CALIFORNIA INLAND—Lassen Peak in northern California is the only active volcano in the United States. Drive through snowbanks, see frozen lakes in mid-summer—yet only a few hundred feet away boiling streams pour clouds of steam in the air. Information on tours from the Southern Pacific Railroad. Season mid-May to Sept. Death Valley, reached from Las Vegas via Union Pacific tour buses during the winter, and Palm Springs, are popular winter resorts. Death Valley Tours, ranging from \$18.00 to \$42.00, include Scotty's Castle, Ghost Cities, Borax works and a trip to see the giant cactus.

Mile-high Lake Tahoe just within the California line from Reno, Nevada is a popular summer area. Buses connect with Southern Pacific trains at Reno, Nevada for the tour along the rim drive, approximately \$6.50 for one day.



BLACK HILLS—Pine-forest mountain area in western South Dakota. Carved from the solid granite on Mt. Rushmore are the 60-foot high memorial heads of Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt. To the east of the Hills lie the Badlands... a region of odd-shaped formations carved from sandstones, shales and clay.

Local tours of one day or longer are available from Rapid City and Custer, South Dakota.



BRUCE AND ZION CANYON NATIONAL PARKS—Great amphitheaters and gorges eroded from colorful sandstones, limestones make a display of fantastic formations. Some walls rise a sheer 2000 feet. Season is mid-May to mid-October. Local bus service and hotel accommodations are provided by the Union Pacific Railroad. Allow two or more days for all-expense tours \$35.00 and up. Also low-cost one-day trips to nearby points.

SALT LAKE CITY—Headquarters of the Mormon Church. See the Mormon Tabernacle and hear the daily organ concerts at noon. Swim in nearby Great Salt Lake or take tours to Bingham Canyon Copper mine, world's largest open-cut copper mine; Mt. Timpanogos and the cave; Alta Ski Lodge (in winter). Tours range from \$3.00 to \$7.50 depending on distance and time.

COLORADO ROCKIES—In Rocky Mountain National Park northwest of Denver, there are 65 mountain peaks over 10,000 feet in elevation and miles of scenic drives. Season mid-June to mid-Oct. Your local ticket agent has one-day tours from \$5.00 to \$15.00.

South of Denver 73 miles is the noted resort of Colorado Springs and to the west of this holidayland Pikes Peak rises 14,110 feet high. During the summer season the trip up and down the peak and to the "Garden of the Gods" may be made from Colorado Springs in a day, cost approximately \$6.50 and up. Free sidetrip to Colorado Springs from Denver on many through tickets. Aspen, an outstanding ski area, lies west of Denver and is reached via Glenwood Springs.

MESA VERDE PARK—At Mesa Verde are the most extensive and best-preserved cliff-dweller ruins in the world. In the large, the Cliff Palace, there are 23 ceremonial chambers and 200 rooms. Season mid-May to mid-October. Bus service from Gallup, New Mexico (140 mi) on the Santa Fe R.R. and Grand Junction on the Rio Grande R.R. Special 3- and 4-day all-expense tours from Santa Fe, New Mexico, \$75.00 to \$125.00.

ROYAL GORGE—The Royal Gorge of the Arkansas River whose walls rise 1100 feet vertically is the daily train service at river level via the Rio Grande Railroad. Trains stop for sightseeing at spectacular "Hanging Bridge" where the railroad clings to the base of the canyon wall.

GRAND CANYON—A tremendous gorge a full mile deep and four to eighteen miles across... the most outstanding example of river erosion in the world. The canyon walls are a mass of changing colors. The South Rim is open all year, the North Rim June-Sept. Your local agent can arrange sidetrips, one day or more, via Santa Fe or Union Pacific R.R.'s. Cost from \$6.50 to \$35.00 for shorter trips.

CARLSBAD CAVERNS—World's largest limestone caverns. The main guided tour takes 5 hours and covers 7 miles of electrically lighted corridors. There are underground restaurants. During the summer season, the evening flight of bats is a spectacular sight. Cavern buses connect with the Santa Fe R.R. at Carlsbad, approximately \$5.50 for tour with Southern Pacific and Texas & Pacific R.R.'s at El Paso, approximately \$12.50 for one-day trip.

Take advantage, too, of swift, all-weather schedules direct to your destination. For example you can travel from Coast-to-Coast in a weekend... or from the Great Lakes to either the Atlantic Coast or the Gulf by day or overnight.

Make your plans in advance and be sure of more hours at the other end!

THE SOUTHWEST—The colorful Southwest is a land rich in contrasts... "wide-open spaces," great mountain ranges; deserts; rich, populous agricultural lands; strikingly modern cities. Sightseeing treats include the Ozark Mountains and Hot Springs in Arkansas; the oilfields of Oklahoma and
