New Mexican Room to the tune of a Mexican orchestra, lounge in the two intriguingly furnished Spanish cocktail rooms, browse around the Indian Curio Shop, sun-bathe on living room suite balconies in the new wing (added 1951) or set out on a conducted "Indian Detour" trip to explore the inhabited pueblos and Indian ruins of the "most interesting hundred-mile square in America" around Santa Fe. Golf, trout fishing, hunting, horseback riding and, in winter, excellent skiing in the nearby Sangre de Cristo Mountains provide further diversions. At times other than the height of the season, La Fonda has become increasingly popular as headquarters for small and medium-sized conventions.

Among the many enterprises of the far-flung Fred Harvey system, La Fonda occupies a singular place. Its fame as one of America's most outstanding hostels is international. Built on the site of the original "fonda" (inn) at the end of the historic Santa Fe Trail, the hotel sweeps back in earth-colored terraces like those of the neighboring Indian pueblos. The furnishings of the public rooms and guest rooms, including many rare pieces from Spain and Mexico, are renowned for their individuality and rich traditional background. The building encloses a rough-tiled patio and a walled outdoor dining place, thus making Southwestern "outdoor living" so typical for La Fonda. Guests enjoy dinner dancing in the
