



### GENERAL INFORMATION

The time tables show the time at which trains may be expected to arrive and depart from stations and to connect with other trains, but departure or arrival or connection at time stated is not guaranteed. This Company reserves the right to vary from the time shown in this folder without notice. The time of connecting transportation companies is published from information available at the time this folder was printed, and every care taken to have it correct, but this Company does not hold itself responsible for any errors or omissions therein.

It is our aim to render satisfactory service, and passengers are requested to report any instance of inattention or incivility on the part of employees. **TICKET OFFICES** are open a sufficient time before the departure of trains to permit the purchase of tickets, and passengers are requested to do so before boarding the train; however some small station offices are closed on Saturday and Sunday and tickets should be purchased in advance at such points.

**CHILDREN** under five years of age will be carried free when accompanied by parent or guardian; five years of age and under twelve, half fare; twelve years of age and over, full adult fare.

**REDEMPTION OF TICKETS.** Wholly unused tickets of this Company's issue may be redeemed at the same office where ticket was purchased if presented by original purchaser within thirty days from date of sale.

Application for redemption of unused portions of tickets of this Company's issue, also wholly unused tickets which have not been presented for redemption at office where sold within the thirty day period, should be made to General Passenger Agent, L & N Railroad, Louisville 1, Ky.

**ADJUSTMENT OF FARES.** In the event of disagreement with Conductors or Agents relative to ticket conditions, privileges allowed, etc., passengers should pay the fare required, take receipt and refer case for adjustment to the General Passenger Agent, Louisville 1, Ky., who will refund any overcharge. Agents and Conductors have no discretionary power in such matters, but are governed by rules which they are not authorized to change.

**HONORING TICKETS TO NON-STOP STATIONS.** Passengers holding tickets to stations at which through trains do not stop, will be required to transfer at some intermediate point (usually the last regular stopping point short of destination) and to use next following local train which is scheduled to stop at destination.

**STOP-OVERS.** One-way tickets are limited to thirty (30) days in addition to date of sale, and stop-overs may be made at any station enroute within final limit of ticket. To secure stop-over passenger should notify the conductor who will endorse ticket and return to passenger. Passengers having availed themselves of stop-over privilege at one or more points must resume use of tickets in time to reach destination before final limit expires.

Stop-overs are also allowed at all points on the Louisville and Nashville Railroad within final limit of Round-Trip tickets by application to conductor. Detailed information regarding stop-overs may be secured from passenger representatives on page 39 of this folder, or from any L. & N. ticket agent. **AIR-CONDITIONED CARS** are generally assigned principal through main line trains and every effort will be made to provide same; but the right is reserved to use non-Air-Conditioned equipment when necessary, due to volume of traffic or operating contingencies.

**TIME—AM OR PM.** Time from 12.01 AM (Midnight) to and including 12.00 Noon is shown in light-faced type and time from 12.01 PM. (Noon) to 12.00 Midnight is printed in dark-faced type.

**STANDARD TIME.** All schedules of the L. & N. R.R. are on Central Standard Time, except at Cincinnati, O., Covington, Ky., Latonia, Ky., Chattahoochee, Fla. and from Corbin, Ky. to Atlanta, Ga. (including branches) and from Corbin, Ky. to Pineville, Ky., Harlan, Ky., Lynch, Ky., Norton, Va. (including branches), where Eastern Standard Time is used.

### BAGGAGE REGULATIONS

**MARKING FOR IDENTIFICATION.** Mark or tag each piece of baggage with name and address; also place name and permanent address inside each piece, whether the baggage is checked or carried on the train.

**ALLOWANCE.** Baggage not exceeding 150 pounds in weight or \$100.00 in value, will be checked free upon presentation of one adult passage ticket, and baggage not exceeding 75 pounds in weight or \$50.00 in value will be checked free for a child traveling on a half-fare ticket.

Unless a greater sum is declared and excess valuation charges be paid therefor, according to tariff regulations, the value of baggage weighing 150 pounds or less checked for an adult is agreed not to exceed \$100.00 in value and the value of baggage weighing 75 pounds or less checked for child traveling on a half-fare ticket is agreed not to exceed \$50.00.

**WEIGHT, SIZE AND LIABILITY.** Baggage weighing in excess of the above free allowances will be charged for in accordance with published tariffs. No single piece of baggage weighing more than 300 pounds, or having dimensions exceeding 72 inches, or valued at more than \$2,500.00, or cardboard cartons weighing more than 50 pounds, will be transported as baggage, but must be sent by express or freight.

**EXCESS CHECK.** Passengers paying charges for excess weight or valuation will receive an excess baggage check, which must be surrendered to Agent with other checks, if any, when baggage is claimed.

**CHECKED TO DESTINATION.** Baggage may be checked to destination of ticket or to an intermediate point, except that holders of round-trip tickets permitting stop-overs, may check baggage to destination, to a point intermediate to destination, or to a point beyond the destination enroute on return trip.

**CHECKED TO NON-AGENCY STATION.** If baggage is checked to a non-agency station, passenger must claim same by presenting checks to train baggage man at baggage car door on arrival at destination. If baggage is not so claimed, it will be carried to next agency station beyond.

**BAD CONDITION.** Baggage that is too frail to withstand necessary handling will not be accepted for transportation in baggage cars, and unlocked or damaged baggage will only be checked after execution of proper release by the shipper.

**STORAGE OF BAGGAGE.** On the first twenty-four hours, free storage is allowed at all stations. After expiration of the free time, storage charges will be assessed at regular tariff rates.

**BICYCLES (NOT MOTORCYCLES), BABY CARRIAGES, AND GUNS** are transported in baggage cars subject to tariff regulations.

**DOGS, CATS AND OTHER SMALL HOUSEHOLD PETS** (Not vicious, odoriferous or otherwise objectionable) when carried in baskets or other containers may be taken into private room accommodations in Pullman cars.

Dogs, properly muzzled and provided with strong, securely fitting collar or harness on chain or other strong leash, or enclosed in crates, will be checked in baggage service at tariff rates.

**FORWARDING.** Passengers are urged to check baggage in advance so that it may be forwarded on a preceding train. Every effort will be made to facilitate the handling, but the Railroad cannot guarantee the forwarding of baggage on same train with owner; nor can time of arrival at destination to which checked be guaranteed.

**LOST ARTICLES** should be inquired for through General Passenger Agent, L. & N. R.R., Louisville 1, Ky., or nearest representative.

**NO RESPONSIBILITY IS ASSUMED** for uncheckered articles left in stations or cars.


